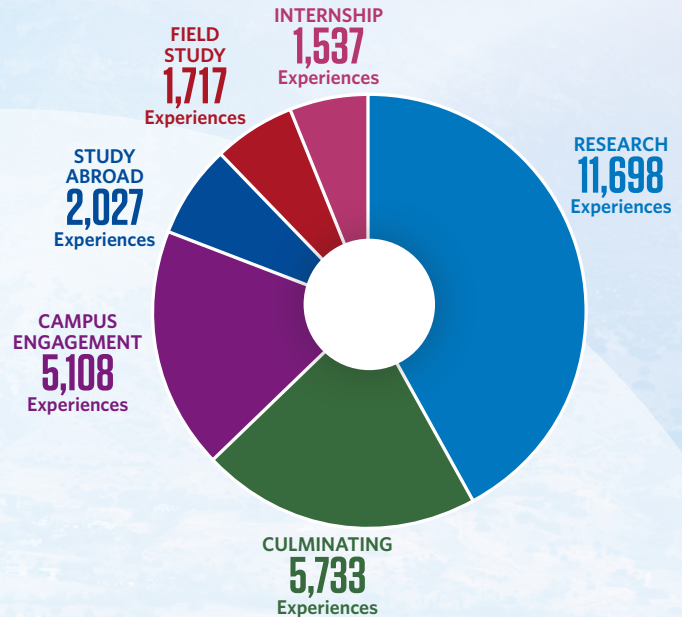

STUDENT EXPERIENCES



Mentored Research: Discovering new information or reaching new understanding of a subject under the direction of a faculty member; applying new practices, processes, policies, resources, or tools in ways that expand or build on what is known.



Culminating Learning Experience: Increasing knowledge or demonstrating mastery of skills by completing a capstone or senior project, writing a thesis, presenting at a conference, performing publicly, or participating in a competition.



Campus Engagement: Applying what is learned in class within a campus-based organization such as BYUSA, clubs, and the Center for Service and Learning or as a teaching assistant or employee within relevant departments.



Study Abroad or Study Away: Experiencing different cultures, peoples, and environments on a faculty-led academic study program.



Field Study or Field Work: Having a faculty-led academic study or work opportunity in a real-world setting.



Internship: Learning in professional settings on or off campus, such as international businesses, not-for-profits, and government entities; completing clinical work, practicums, and student teaching.
(Academic internships are largely tracked in a separate database.)
